1 Zamea, (Caffer Bread-tree,) 12½ feet long, weighing about 5 à 6 cwt.; 4 Testudinaria Elephantipes, from 160 to 275 lbs.

One Plant of the CACTUS OPUNTIA with the COCHINEAL INSECTS, from Hamburgh, per Norden.—This plant has been placed, since its arrival, under a glass shade, and I am happy to state, that four plants of the Cactus Tuna (plentiful about Cape Town,) which I placed near the Cactus Opuntia with the Insects, are full of the young breed; and I entertain the best hopes of its succeeding in this Colony, so as to enable me to distribute some of the plants with the insects—gratis—at the close of this year.
